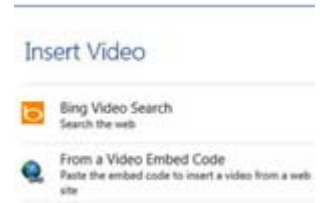
Inserting Online Videos in Word 2013
